Impact In Action: 43,484 New Yorkers Supported in 2024



Our just-released Impact

Report demonstrates how our integrated care model supports New Yorkers with the housing, mental health and substance use treatment, primary care, and the vocational training they need to feel and be better. In 2024, thanks to our committed staff and dedicated funders and donors, we empowered 43,484 people to improve their lives. Highlights include: moving more than 1,800 families and single adults into permanent housing; expanding life-saving addiction services for 1,600 people; reducing hospitalization rates by 30%; and alleviating depression among half of the participants in our veterans recovery programs. We also began construction on our award-winning 422-unit affordable, supportive, and transitional green housing development. The Power of Volunteers: Building Joy for Families

Thanks to a generous grant from Lowe's and the helping hands of Red Vest Associates, renovations will transform an empty lot at our Gloria's House Family Transitional Residence into a vibrant playground and community space. Volunteers helped kick off the project earlier this month. When the playground opens later this



fall, it will benefit more than 325 families, including nearly 600 children a year. At all of our shelters, we strive to provide families with a sense of stability and to support children's wellbeing, play, and social connection. Thanks to Lowe's, families at Gloria's House will now have a place where they can relax and spend time together, and where kids can experience the joy of just being kids.



We are Doubling Down on Doing Good


